**The future of mobile phones**

Today, about 60% of teenagers in the UK have a mobile phone. 90% of teenagers think *everyone* will have a phone in 10 years' time. Jessica told us, 'I use my mobile phone to call and text my friends. I don't use it to surf the net because it's too slow.'



90% of teenagers think that in 10 years' time they'll use mobile phones to surf the net every day. They say that mobile phones and mobile phone services will get a lot cheaper. Stan says, 'I don't download music because it's expensive.' 5% of teenagers we talked to think mobile phones will be *free* in 10 years' time! They say we'll be able to go into a shop and choose one we like. And we'll change it every week if we want to!

About 50% of teenagers think mobile phones will organise our homes. They'll open and close our windows, control our heating and tell us what is in the fridge. Luella says, 'Mobile phones will do lots of jobs for us.'

And finally, will we watch television and our favourite films on our mobile phones? 50% of teenagers think so. Jason says, 'I already watch videos on my mobile, in 10 years mobile phones will have fantastic screens and everyone will watch TV on them.'

One last question. Will we use mobile phones to call people? Maybe we'll be too busy to do that!
