Mozart: Child Genius

Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart was born on 27 January 1756 in Salzburg, Austria. He was a brilliant musician even as a child. He wrote his first symphony when he was eight! It was better than many symphonies by adult composers. In his life he wrote more than 600 pieces of music. Many of them are famous today. Mozart married Constanze Weber in 1782. He died nine years later on 5 December 1791 at the age of thirty-five. Some people believe that another composer, Antonio Salieri, killed him out of jealousy. However, most people think he died because of an unusual illness.

In 1984 there was a popular film about Mozart’s life called *Amadeus*. It won eight Oscars. The American actor, Tom Hulce, played Mozart.
